

Dear Dr. Stenzel,

We are finally back in England, where we will stay until we return to Texas in late January. Henry did some successful work at Salsbery, and he will work at Harwell the remainder of his time. We have a comfortable house at Abingdon, just six miles from the Gov. Clegg Hall in School Lane, and I will have good train connections for London and the Midlands there. We are also just six miles from Oxford. The country around Harwell is more interesting than the Cambridge area, and we are quite near to such charming and historic places as Winchester, Salisbury, Bath, and Stonehenge. We saw all these places except Bath this last week end. Also Walter King Alfred's birth place, is only six miles away! We are going to enjoy the part of England even more than we did Cambridge.

Our tour of Germany, Holland, Denmark, and Southern Sweden was fine, - but somewhat too rushed as some of the unfortunately are. The most striking impression I preserve is the amazing recovery all of these countries have made from the war. Their energy in producing and rebuilding makes France's failure all the more alarming. The Germans appear reformed. I hope that they are, for their dogged industry certainly will make them dangerous enemies if they try even for world power again. We could see no inclination to do so.

Philip's future sounds like more of the same - Alabama and military again. What do you think of Dr. Daniels' taking Dad Savin's job? I simply won't comment, but you can guess what I think in spite of my personal friendship for the Daniels.
