Dear Professor Bentz:

Thank you very much for your kind letter of August 30 and the publication of your institution. Both were very much welcome.

I am very sorry to have missed you during your visit to Austin. It would have been nice to talk to you and to find out about my friends and their conditions in Germany. However, pressure of work here is so great that one has very little time left over--even to think. I was trying to get my field work done at that date. As you know I am working in the Tertiary of the Gulf Coastal Plain, and that kind of geology is very obscure and requires much more work than one would ordinarily have to do.
