My dear Dr. Hesse:

The suggestion has been made by one to whom your interesting paper on fossil turtle eggs was submitted for further critical reading, that, in view of the fact that further papers are forthcoming on the Miocene near Burkeville, perhaps it would be better to postpone the discussion of the eggs themselves to a later place in the series. This will save considerable repetition of the data given on pages 3-10 and put, what is in a sense problematical, in its proper place, subordinate to the more extensive and less conjectural part of the discussion as a whole.

Should you care to consider this suggestion, we would be glad to see the successive results with this in its reduced form near the end of the series, with a view of publication in the American Journal of Science. But as you may have other sources of publication in mind, perhaps you would not care to consider this proposition.
