    - i. *This challenge will crowdsource the best student ideas to actually be implemented in a case competition style format. Passed by hand vote 27 for*

  - a. A.R. 13, In Support of Black Students and the Black Lives Matter Movement
    - i. *This resolution is a statement of solidarity and support for the black members of the Longhorn community. The resolution speaks to the affirming and empowering message of the Black Lives Matter movement and establishes an official endorsement of the movements efforts to combat systemic and institutionalized racism and bias. The legislation establishes a position of support for anti-racism work on the Forty Acres and elsewhere. The legislation also calls upon the University to create and implement a hate crime policy and to promote an anti-racist environment on the Forty Acres. sent to Student Affairs*
