H. B. Stenzel (The University of Texas, Austin, Tex.): Cretaceous crabs, lobsters, and shrimps from the vicinity of Dallas, Texas.

Abstract

California Crossing near Dallas is the richest crustacean locality of the Eagle Ford group (Turmanian). The great number of specimens available ~~there~~ makes it possible to investigate thoroughly nearly each species found there. The fossil crustacean fauna of the Cretaceous of Texas is one of the best in the world and its description promises to be of major importance in elucidating the evolution of these animals and their stratigraphic succession and ranges.
