
I've had my dinner in honor, and my lecture in fabulously snowy Iannina, and lunches, and even a supper tonight, and I've seen La Clemenzia di Tito last night, and I have the permission to start seriously in the Museum. I could have done it Thursday and Friday even, but had not anticipated the schedule, so was not ready. But Monday I will be ready and try to do it very steadily.

The other thing I want to be sure to remember to put in this letter is my schedule on coming back to the States. I said and asked something while you were here, but now have a little more definite vague possibilities, and am about to start talking to travel people. I think now that I shall start home a little before I had hoped, but at least with good reason on the American end. My present notion is that in the course of my Wanderwoche I may show up in Austin about the 20th 21st July, hang about for about 4 5 days, and then go up toward the North. The troubles are that I don't just know in what order I'll make what stops. Another that I probably ought to make is in Detroit, to see my mother (last time in Dec 1985). Or, I haven't figured out where I can conveniently leave temporarily all the extra luggage I'm sure to be bringing back. Now if you were still in New York, I'd just stuff it in your apartment. On the other hand making long round trips to and from NY is not so nice either. Anyhow, sometime of the week of the 20th may see me in Austin. I will in the next letter or so let you know more of my imaginings, and eventually of real schedules. I've told Loretta about this much, but don't really want to tell others in Madison what I am doing until after I've done it.

I hope all is going well with you and with Cynthia, and send you both my very best wishes,
