Dear Dr. Stenzel:

I will send you by tomorrow's mail the lobster which I have had for a number of years. This lobster was collected in the so-called Denison group about fifty feet above the Fort Worth limestone. I did not pick up the specimen myself, but one of my students brought it to me when I was teaching at Polytechnic College. It was found in the river bluff east of the general direction of Sycamore Creek at Fort Worth. This is the stream which cuts off Polytechnic Heights from Fort Worth proper. It was found about three-quarters of a mile north of the Fort Worth pike. As near as I was able to figure at the time it was somewhere in the *Gryphea washitaensis* zone. The specimen was picked up loose, however, so it is possible that it might have come from a slightly higher zone.

I hope that you can find that it is something new and that it can be returned to our museum as a type specimen.
