Dear Doc:

Am sending your field notes back before they are
lost, thought possibly you might need it sometime —

As for the paper — Have a feeling I pulled a
homer there & John T. should have let me know
he was going to publish it so I could check it out —
I have reference to is that yellow mineral referred
to on page 130 — I never did get any satisfactory
results using the liquids that I had — I had
to work with melted sulfur on this one. John wrote
later that he had separated some of it & couldn't
do much with it but it might ~~be~~ be garnet.
That doesn't check with the index of refraction that I found.
John checked that with me at the time too. Demand if
I know what the thing is. Might be garnet as he
wrote — hope not.

I spent about a week in Shreveport at the District office
and then went to Marshall and stayed there & worked with
Purcell on the Mt. Selman group for about 12 days while they

going to try to map the base of the Jackson here to start
with while I'm building up a section - it very nearly
all looks alike (Jackson), Don't know whether there are
any units that can be traced or not. The base of the
Jackson is not going to be so different I don't believe,
have just about got it from block paring out of those
terrible hills and bantles bordering the river. Lateley have
collected some wonderful specimens in the lower Jackson
great big things. Haven't bothered much with the stuff above
the base yet.

and happy - wish we could see you.
