Dear Emmett:

Thank you for your letter of February 28th which has just come and for Miss Richard's useful letter which you enclosed. Yours seems to have crossed mine of the 24th. I am afraid I did not make it clear that Alan and I have regarded the books as having four authors, Alan, you, Chadwick, and Lisa. I represent Alan on your distribution slips (which seem to me a good idea) but Lisa's name must be there, as well as mine, as she is actually a contributor and it is important to her professionally. She is now a member of the London Seminar and took part in the discussion when Sinclair gave his talk. In principle then each author (in lieu of offprints) has six free copies. I agreed (in my letter to you of February 19th) to pay for 50 of the 75 copies for which we get the 40 % discount, intending some of these to be for the reserve pool. (It occurs to me that it might be simpler for me to pay the whole bill when you receive it and we can make adjustments later when we know how the numbers are working out.) I will ask Lisa to send her distribution list direct to you so that you can weed out any overlapping. We do want to see the list of yours and Chadwick's when it is in order.

I am glad to see that Miss Richard's "final guess" is roughly what we surmised though not quite what we hoped. Imagine Heffers will not be too happy but they are making their own arrangements direct with the Society. I gather the Society is paying for review copies - I wish we could choose the reviewers.
