

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 22

INTRODUCED BY
MR. VICE PRESIDENT AND SENATOR BENAVIDES

A RESOLUTION

PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE 3.36 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STUDENTS' ASSOCIATION, RELATING TO THE NUMBER OF ABSENCES FOR TWO YEAR AT LARGE SENATORS.

WHEREAS, one year senators are allowed up to three absences per year, and

WHEREAS, two year senators are only allowed up to three absences for two years, and

WHEREAS, it is unreasonable for two year senators to have the same amount of absences as one year senators; now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE STUDENT SENATE OF THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS:

Section 1. That Article 3.36 of the Constitution of the Association be amended to read as follows:

"3.36 One year Student Senators who are absent from three (3) scheduled meetings of the Student Senate shall be automatically removed from office. Two year at large Senators who are absent from three (3) scheduled meetings per year shall be automatically removed from office. Vacancies shall be filled under the terms of 3.4."

Section 2. The foregoing constitutional amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the members of the Students Association at the general election to be held the first Wednesday in March, 1987, at which election the ballots shall be printed to provide for voting for or against the proposition: "The constitutional amendment providing for two year senators to accumulate six (6) unexused absences before removal from office."


