Dear Mr. Sturani:

Your letter of January 10, 1958, has been received today. You are indeed fortunate to have available abundant material for the study of Miocene *Aturias*. I understand that *Aturia aburi* (Basterot) itself is rather rare at the type locality and its general vicinity in Southern France. So your locality in Piemonte is unusual and important, and a thorough study of the material is desirable.
