Dear Mr. Brice,

Very many thanks for your letter and four sets of proofs. These arrived most opportunely for this morning. I had by arrangement a call from our Fellow Mr. Terence Bruce Mitford of St. Andrew's, who saw Sir John's manuscript before Scripta Minoa III was accepted for printing and who knows the history of the undertaking. I was able to show him Professor Bennett's letter and set of proofs before he set off for Cyprus. He agrees with the proposal that we should now wait until the late summer or early autumn when various people will have returned from abroad. We can then form a small committee of those able and willing to help in deciding our next step. For example, Mr. Ventris is at present in Greece.

We shall most certainly wish to accept your kind offer of help when that time comes. We are, as you know, most grateful to you for all the labour you have expended on the text and we can certainly go no further without your help. Meanwhile I will file your letter with its valuable list of suggestions.
