It is very fine that you are trying to elucidate the relationships of the Tubulostims. I shall be glad to send you the material that is available here. While the various species of that group are rather common, the particular portions that you wish to study are rare and it will take some searching to find them. Dr. B. F. Howell of the Geology Department, Princeton University, Princeton, New Jersey, U.S.A. has been studying these forms for some time, and he has put out several preliminary abstracts in the proceedings of the Geological Society of America. From what I gathered in conversation he seems to be working on exactly the same points that you are.
