Dear Doc:

I was extremely sorry to have missed spending some time with you during the last field trip of the Mississippi Geological Society in Alabama. I hope it will not be too long before you come back to Alabama and look us up again some time.

I returned from my trip to Egypt during the middle of December. The trip was exciting, especially so as we were able to travel over a good bit of Egypt. I spent some time at Dakhla and Kharga oases in the Libyan desert and along the Mediterranean coast from Alexandria to Sollum. We instigated a detailed ground-water study including test drilling and subsurface geology in the delta south of Cairo prospecting for water supplies for irrigation.

In reviewing the literature on my return, published during the three months absence, I read a review in the AAPG Bulletin of your report, "The geology of Henry's Chapel Quadrangle, northeast Cherokee County, Texas." I would very much appreciate if you could make a personal copy of this report available to me. As you probably know, Lyman and I used many of your ideas in the bulletin on Leon County in presenting our data in the Choctaw County report. The review spoke so highly of your methods of presentation for the Henry's Chapel Quadrangle report that I would like to use it as an aid for ideas in preparing the text for the Wilcox County report.

At the present we are publishing the road profile, a north-south section along Highway 29 in Choctaw County. It is to be published as a chart of the Alabama Geological Survey.

I hope to see you again soon.
