We have been building our collection in hydrology, water policy and water resources, including publications of federal agencies and state water boards. We have also enlarged our holdings in remote sensing and lunar geology.

Dr. Young's course in environmental geology has proved so popular we have had to buy heavily in this field, which includes pollution, as well.

We have continued to try to obtain publications from Australia. This year we filled in all Bulletins still in print from the Western Australia Geological Survey. We also acquired a full set--except for v. 13 which is out of print--of the Memoirs of the Victoria, Australia, National Museum; since no. 1 was published in 1904, we were fortunate to be able to obtain these on exchange.

Maps added this year totaled 4,719.

#### James F. Quinlan

I should like to call particular attention to the help in all fields we have received through the efforts of Jim Quinlan, a doctoral candidate. He is so thoroughly knowledgeable on geology--especially sedimentation, hydrology, and karst--and has helped me immensely in reference problems in these fields. In addition he has given us many duplicates from his library and enriched our library immeasurably, especially in the fields of karst and speleology. He is now a post-doctorate fellow in Geography at McMaster University, Hamilton, Ontario. His help is sorely missed.

#### Geology Foundation Sales

During the year many duplicates from the collections given to the Geology Foundation were sold, the total of all sales amounting to \$2,119.00. This amount was added to our Books for Geology (30-6802-6260) account. The University of Texas at Dallas purchased \$2,091 of this amount.
