Dear Emmett,

Thank you for the new batch of suggestions for the 2nd ed. of M & M. I shall be able to make use of them in connexion with the various foreign language versions now in progress. It is extremely good of you to take all this trouble. I wish you could read the proofs of my Interpretation, now in its final stages. I have just finished the proofs of the Glossary.

I was surprised to hear that Antiquity is not in your library. Are there any other offprints of my various papers that you lack. I may be able to supply copies. The "Unknown Vessel" is merely one item of evidence of a kind which I have been able to elicit for virtually all quarters of the palace. The elaborate excavations of 1922-25, especially those of 1923, were never reported. All this will be in my book The Find Places of the Knossos Tablets, the first proofs of which should be completed by late August.

By the way did I send you an offprint of the chapter on Homer: Language and Dialect in the book published by Macmillan (London). I seem to recollect that in Nestor this work was credited to the Cambridge University Press.
