Thank you for the letters of recommendation which you wrote to Columbia University and Cornell University this spring. I also appreciated very much the advise to come to Yale.

When I took Geology 379 in my senior year, I had some dark moments wondering if I should ever become a field geologist, but it was the best course I have had, I believe. Geology 378 was also very enlightening to me.

At present, I am taking French and German in Yale's summer school. Along with reading exams in these two languages in September, I will take a departmental "Screening Test" given to students after their first year in graduate study.

My Mother, my youngest brother, a friend of his, and myself had a keen trip to New Haven. We were particularly impressed with the beauty of the Ozarks north of Ft.
