David Anderson was quoted in the Austin American-Statesman, Dec. 22, 2000, on a Texas Supreme Court decision involving alleged defamation of a public official in a news broadcast.

Mark Ascher spoke to the Austin Tax Study Group, Jan. 16, 2001, on "The New Separate Share Rule for Estates." **Ascher** has agreed to serve as reporter for a committee of the Real Estate, Probate and Trust Law Section of the State Bar of Texas, to decide whether to propose that Texas adopt the Uniform Trust Code in whole or in part.

Philip Bobbitt's remarks at the presentation of the Rebekah Johnson Bobbitt National Prize for Poetry at the Library of Congress were quoted in the New York Times, Dec. 20, 2000.

At the Law School's Advanced Patent Law Institute, Nov. 16-17, 2000, **Gambrell** spoke on choice of law issues when antitrust law confronts the rights of patent owners before the Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit.

Douglas Laycock will be honored by the Central Texas Civil Liberties Union with its John Henry Faulk Civil Libertarian of the Year award, for his U.S. Supreme Court brief in Santa Fe ISD v. Doe, in which the Court banned prayer before high school football games. The award will be presented at the CTCLU Gala on Feb. 10, 2001, in Austin.
