



MINUTES

The Students' Association Students' Assembly of the University of Texas at Austin and members of the Cabinet of College Councils had a special meeting at 7:08 p.m. on Sept. 27, 1994 in the Main Building Rm 212. The president was in the chair and the secretary was present.

The roll was called with the following representatives not present: Beck, Garcia, Goleman, Hasan, Massell, Music, Scott, Pappas, Wilson and Wyrick.

The roll was called with the following College Cabinet Councils absent: Student Engineering, Fine Arts, GLISSA and ANGS.

There were no reports from the president, vice president, executive director, chair of the Cabinet of College Councils, financial director and attorney general.

There were no appointments. There was nothing under local and consent, and there was nothing under unfinished or finished business.

John Durbin (mathematics department) and Alan Klein (computer sciences department) addressed the Assembly as to why the University Council wanted to nullify the students' vote in the Council. In addition to the speakers, a panel of faculty answered questions from the Assembly.

A sample of the questions included the following:

What will become of the students if our voice is eliminated? If our voting power is so minimal, then why can't the Council retain student votes to make us happy? How does an elimination of our vote create a direct link to the administration? What are we getting out of this?

Questions directed toward the panel came from representatives Keith, Almuti, Aruh, Gray, Hendin, Sheffield, Cabellero and Bravenec. Council members from Graduate Engineering, Graduate Public Affairs, Liberal Arts, Graduate Business, Natural Sciences, and Graduate entertained questions, also. Executive officers that posed questions were President Black, Executive Director Eastman, Attorney General Boyles and Chair of the Cabinet of College Councils Wilkov.

The majority of the Assembly was against the proposal to cut off the students' vote in the University Council. There will be a faculty meeting at 2:15 p.m. on Monday, Oct. 3, 1994. All assembly members are urged to attend to hear more about the proposal.

There were no members' privileges and the meeting was adjourned.
