We are having trouble with the recalcitrant Fig. 22, but the following ideas will get us nearer to satisfactory solutions of the problems.

I like your figure legend, but had to revise it in a minor way in order to make sure that it is understandable. The revised legend is enclosed. I hope you approve it.

As to the illustrations themselves, the cut-off at the bottom is unfortunate and must be avoided. I suggest that the figures be oriented diagonally. In that fashion they do not have to be cut off and can be made to fill the page better. The labeling would have to be moved and might be rearranged to fill the empty space better. Shell Oil Company could furnish new photo prints.
