Dear Dr. Stenzel:

What with the flu, a report to the president of the University on the Graduate School, and various other things, I did not get around to the matter of sending the fossil lobster until yesterday. Your letter came in this morning. If you do not receive the lobster shortly let me know.

There is one thing which puzzled me slightly and that is the label written in ink. It is not in my handwriting. My memory is that the fossil came from the horizon about which I wrote in my letter which is above the Fort Worth limestone. If it was found near Tandy's Lake then my identification of the horizon is correct because Tandy's Lake is just above the horizon of *Gryphea washitaensis*.

I hope that you will find this specimen interesting. We should be happy to have it returned to us as a type specimen of course.
