Your latest letter (May 5th) has been received today, and I am happy to note that you are pleased with the Cretaceous fossils from Dallas. From time to time, it will be possible to send you more ammonites. At present, another package is being prepared for you. It will include several more Worthoceras vermiculus which has excellent sutures preserved.

The oysters on my list are desiderata because they are type species of genera and sub-genera. However, any other well-preserved oysters might be of interest too. We have here a young man who is starting an investigation of rudistids and their relatives. If you happen to be able to obtain some of them, we would be glad to have them.
