Lynn Baker and **Charles Silver** spoke on "Ethical Issues for the Personal Injury Attorney" at the Law School's 22nd Annual Page Keeton Products Liability & Personal Injury Law Conference, Oct. 29, 1998, in Austin.

At the State Bar's 12th Annual Juvenile Law Conference, Feb. 18-19, 1999, in Austin, **Robert Dawson** will present a legislative preview and a case law update, and **Barbara Hines** will speak on immigration law and juveniles.

Lynn Baker accepted the invitation of the William & Mary Law Review to contribute a paper to their symposium on "Supermajority Rules as a Constitutional Solution." The paper, entitled "Getting from Here to There: The Rebirth of Constitutional Constraints on the Special Interest State" (coauthored with Samuel H. Dinkin), will be published with the other symposium contributions in vol. 40 of the William & Mary Law Review. **Baker** has been elected Chair of the AALS Section of State and Local Government Law for 1999-2000. In the Introduction to his annual report (jointly published with the Kennedy School at Harvard) on "The Federal Budget and the States" for Fiscal Year 1997, Senator Daniel Patrick Moynihan refers repeatedly to **Baker's** article (co-authored with Samuel H. Dinkin), *The Senate: An Institution Whose Time Has Gone?*, 13 Journal of Law & Politics 21 (1997).

Sarah Cleveland will deliver a paper on "The History of Foreign Affairs Law" at a symposium on "Foreign Affairs Law at the End of the Century" at the University of Colorado School of Law, Jan. 22, 1999. **Cleveland** has been appointed by the Legal Services Corporation to a Special Panel charged with investigating Legal Services representation of foreign (H-2A) guestworkers.
