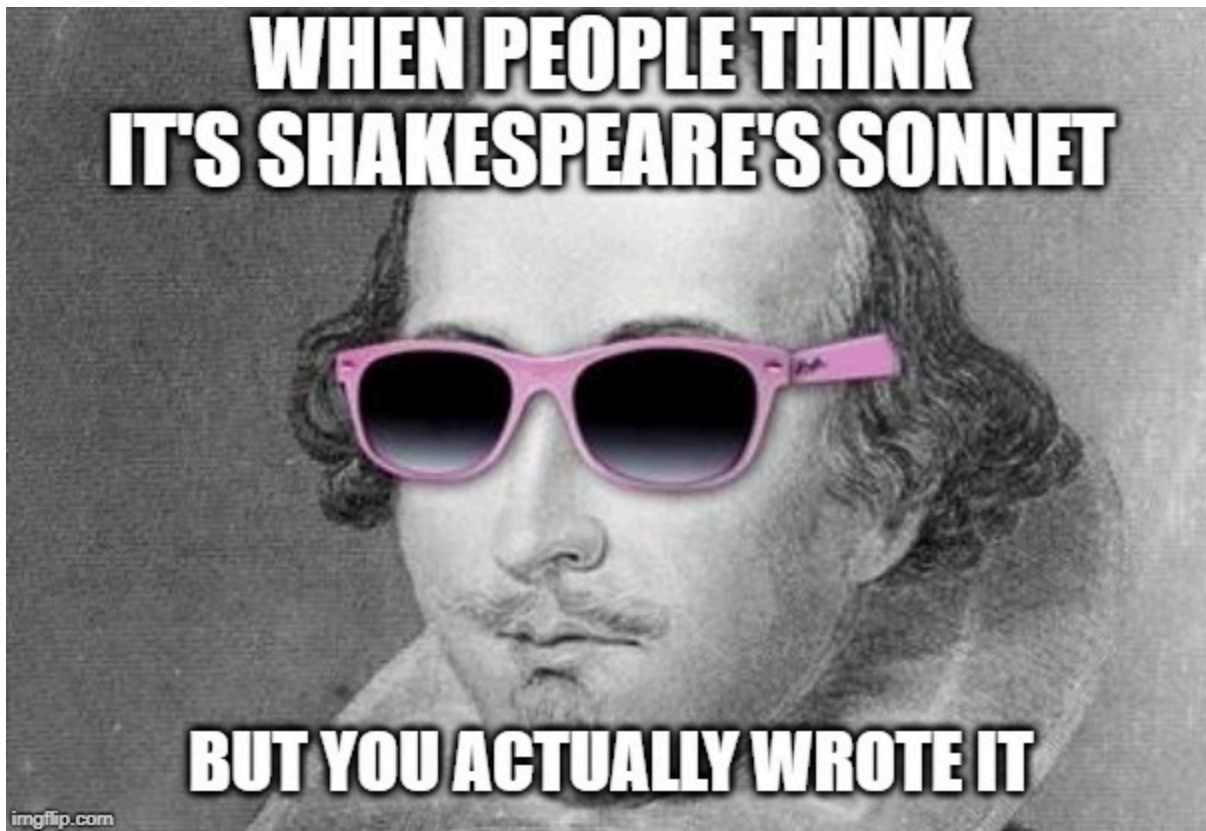




155: Lost Shakespeare sonnet discovered
