Dear Miss Kober:

I have now read your article and wish to print it. We are having a great deal of trouble with the press because of man power shortage and I am really frightened to send it now. Do you think you could draw each block of signs as they occur in the manuscript, so that they ^{please} do not have to pick out and identify the signs and put them together? In other words, you would draw in india ink everything just as it appears in the manuscript and you would leave enough space between so that they could reproduce each phrase separately or reproduce several on a block and cut them apart. The simple signs are so frail that they break and we were obliged last time, as you recall, to spend \$60 on electrotypes. I think the method I am suggesting would be much preferable, and I am afraid they would refuse to print it if we attempted to reproduce the material as we did last time.
