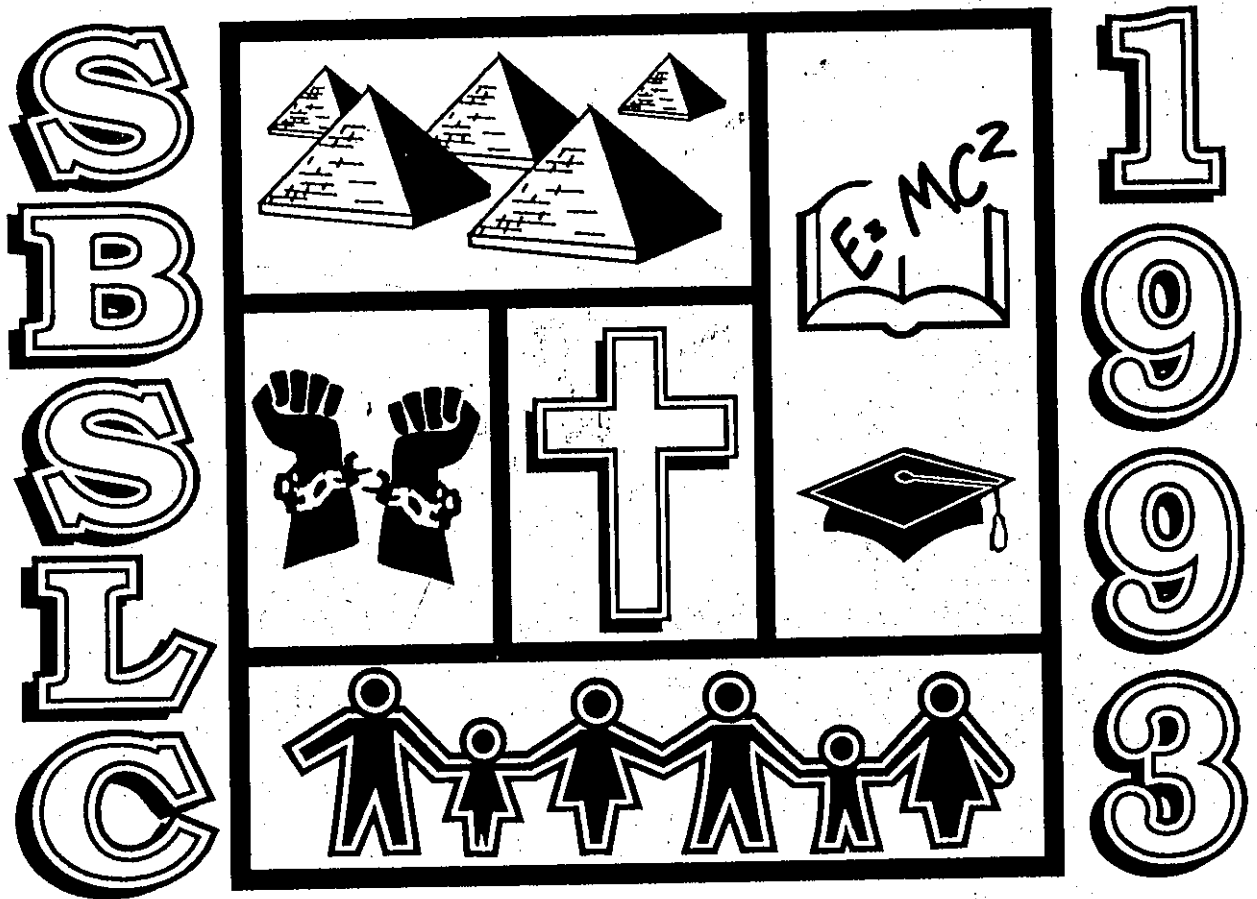

HISTORY

Realizing that African-Americans in the Southwest needed an arena in which to address the problems and concerns facing Blacks, innovative students on the campus of Texas A&M University founded and implemented the Southwestern Black Student Leadership Conference. Since the first annual SBSLC held January 26-29, 1989, the conference has been a successful vehicle by which issues facing the African-American student and community are addressed. Held on the third weekend of January each year, the conference unites approximately 1000 students and faculty, nationally recognized speakers, and corporations throughout the country. SBSLC is dedicated to addressing and solving these major issues as well as fostering new relations among students of all levels, service agencies, and corporate America.

Over the last four years, SBSLC has focused on a number of dynamic themes, including: "Today's Black Leaders: Our Hope for Tomorrow," "Discovering the Keys to Success," and "Armoring for the Age of Ascension." With each conference, enlightening speakers convey these themes and a message that there is an urgent need for minority leaders. A few notable examples of the powerful orators that have participated in SBSLC include: Dr. Benjamin Hooks, former NAACP Executive Director; Susan Taylor, Editor of Essence magazine; Charles Barron, CEO of Dynamics of Leadership, Inc.; and Wilhelmina Delco of the Texas House of Representatives. SBSLC also hosts a corporate sponsored career fair to establish and invaluable link between African-American students and the corporate world. Through the past four years, the conference has received resounding success. SBSLC '93, the fifth anniversary for the conference, is expected to be even more educational and successful than its predecessors.

MISSION

The theme of the fifth annual Southwestern Black Student Leadership Conference for 1993 is "Empowered by the Past: Focused on the Future." As African-Americans we are empowered by the strength, dedication and determination of our ancestors and focused on a future in which we strive for success and excellence.

Through the use of history, self-improvement techniques, leadership skills and the knowledge of corporate America, this year's conference plans to inspire and motivate young black collegians to be productive leaders of tomorrow.

The importance of incorporating education in conjunction with family, religion and community involvement as significant tools to become productive members of society is our mission as "Today's Black Leaders: Our Hope for Tomorrow."

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

TO FUND INTO THE STREETS KICK-OFF WEEK INCLUDING INTENSE PROGRAMMING TO INCREASE STUDENT VOLUNTEER INVOLVEMENT IN THE AREAS OF AIDS, YOUTH AT RISK, RACE RELATIONS, HUNGER AND HOMELESSNESS, AND SENIOR CITIZENS; NOW THEREFORE,

Be it enacted by the Student Assembly of the University of Texas that:

SECTION I: The Students' Association shall allocate \$380.00 from the Special projects fund to the Into The Streets student organization.

SECTION II: The money will be used only for the food, publicity, room equipment and speaker fees.

SECTION III: The funds will revert to the SA should they not be spent in accordance with allocation procedures.
