MINUTES

A regular meeting of the Students' Assembly of the Students' Association of the University of Texas at Austin was called to order at 7:05 P.M. on November 30, 1993, in the Main Building room 212. Vice-President Karen Netzer presided over the meeting and the secretary was present.

The minutes from the November 16, 1993 meeting were approved.

Morgan Watkins from the computation center spoke in lieu of a Vice-President's report about the computation center on the second floor of the UGL. Thursday December 2, he will be on the second floor at 5:00 P.M. to give a tour of the new facility.

The Executive Director's report was given next. Jason Blair said office hours end this week. A.P. 25 WOMEN'S RETREAT FOR DELTA SIGMA THETA was called to question by Rep. Eastman. Passed.

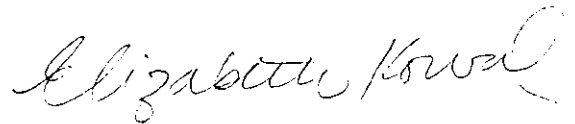
A.B.27 ADDING NATIVE AMERICANS TO THE MINORITY INFORMATION CENTER was called to question by Rep. Caplan. Passed.

A.R. 15 SUPPORT FOR UNION FRANCHISING had two friendly amendments. Rep. Adkins requested the wording in section B to be changed to, "Any dining area shared by any business..." In section D, Rep. Shepherd requested the wording be changed to, "Priority for employment will be given to students, and then to all who are interested." Rep. Hendrix called to question. It passed.

Rep. Gray made a motion on behalf of Rep. Pappas to move into a committee of a whole to discuss A.B. 20; the motion failed.

Announcements were made, the final roll call was taken, and the meeting was adjourned at 8:30 P.M.
