
Dear Mr. Stenzel:

We are at present enlarging and reorganizing the paleontological collections at Stanford and need considerable Tertiary and Recent material. As you have advertised in the Nautilus for exchange, I am writing you.

We can use, of course, any Tertiary material and any but the extremely common Recent species. I am, however, now engaged in assembling our venerids and am especially anxious to get as many species of the family Veneridae (both Tertiary - or earlier, for that matter - and Recent) and hope you have a number to offer.

In the way of exchange, we can offer at least 200 species. I am sorry that I cannot give you a list of available material - but assembling such a list would take time that must be spent on the collection. I would suggest that you send me a list of species you desire particularly, if you have any preference.
