While investigating the type locality of the Littig Conglomerate, which is the basal conglomerate of the Danian in Texas, I found a new species of Discinisca. This Discinisca is very similar to your D. davisii from Bracklesham. Your two publications concerning Disciniscas have come in very handy in describing and evaluating the new Danian species. If you still have spare copies of these two articles (Proc. Geologists' Assoc., v. 50, pt. 2, pp. 149-158; ibidem, v. 39, pt. 2, pp. 463-470), I would appreciate them very much.

I hope to be able to visit Copenhagen and London this summer. It should be possible, if my health stands up. There are so many Tertiary localities in England and France I would like to inspect.
