Dear Stenzel:

This is to acknowledge receipt of your letter of  
Sept. 25:

In regard to the Leon County map, I have a map of this county with me and I am sending it to you under another cover on which we will be very glad to have you copy the geology. As soon as you send this map back to me with the geology on it I shall have a negative photostat made and sent to you. If you should then need to have any other copies of the map made to send to the National Research Council or any other organization you will only need to have a print made from this negative. I am forwarding your letter to Mr. Thompson and I am sure that he will be very pleased to have a copy of this map.

In regard to my Tertiary collections from Alabama, Mississippi and Florida I shall repeat my verbal proposition which I made to you a few weeks ago so that you may accept it if you wish. I shall ship these collections to you as you need them provided you agree to accept them under the following conditions. You agree to identify the material and when the forms have been identified we will divide the material that you have identified good and bad specimens equally. In the case of the collections of dirt for washing you agree to carry on your work in such a way that you will save a representative cut of reasonable size from each sample which is to be carefully labeled as they are now and which is to be returned to me. These cuts and wax residues from washing are to be used by the Vacuum Oil Co. Inc. for the identification of forams and other small fossils.

It is understood that you do not have any equity in these collection until they have been identified and my half returned to me along with the material for formal identification.
