Dear Sir!

I found your name and address in the Geological - Newsletter, which I receive monthly from Washington. I would like to know if there exist any openings for me at your institute in the immediate future.

The reason that I desire a position in the U.S. is the following one: From 1953 until now I was established as consulting- and research geologist in Holland, and have done some exploration- and research work for smaller European mining companies and- contractors. But although this work is quite interesting, there is too less to do in this branch in Europa at the moment.

From 1947-1953 I devoted myself to the study of geology and mining engineering at 3 well known European universities and the Technical Highschool.

In 1953 I did my examination for the degree of Doctorandus of Geology (= M. Sc.), and studied during all these years: physical geology, geomorphology, paleontology/stratigraphy, historical geology, tectonic geology, mining engineering, petrography (-logy), mineralogy and prehistory. Apart from this I have written (1954-1955) two handbooks (stratigraphy and phys. geol.) for the Dutch and Belgium students, and have given several lectures for scientific organisations. My age is 28 years.

Finally I hope soon to receive some message from you.
