LIEUTENANT JOHN HENRY BROMAGE, D.S.O., D.S.C., R.N.

It is just one month since Lieut. Bromage was awarded the D.S.O. for "outstanding zeal, efficiency and daring in successful submarine patrols."

Lieut. Bromage was born in 1915 and entered the Submarine Branch of the Royal Navy in 1937. His first submarine was the famous SNAPPER, and while serving in her he was awarded the D.S.C. for his part in operations in the Skaggerak and Kattegat at the time of the Norwegian Campaign.

Later he transferred to the submarine SEALION. He served as First Lieutenant under the redoubtable Commander Ben Bryant and took part in many of the successful actions with which the SEALION's name is linked.

Lieut. Bromage was appointed to the command of the submarine SAHIB in March 1942. She has recently operated against Axis lines of supply in the Mediterranean with conspicuous success, having sunk and damaged many thousands of tons of enemy shipping.
