POST OFFICE WANTS 3,000 MORE WOMEN ENGINEERS

Bib and Brace Uniforms

Another 3,000 women engineers will be needed by the Post Office during 1942, bringing the total number of this section up to 5,000. So many of the G.P.O.'s experienced engineers are now working on war communications that the best qualified of the women will have to take on the full duties performed by the Department's skilled workmen.

A blue serge bib and brace uniform is to be issued to women doing minor repair work in telephone exchanges and dismantling and cleaning apparatus at the repair depots. Trousers will be worn by those who call on telephone subscribers to fit new instruments or attend to faults.

Training schools have been opened so that women already employed and the newcomers can be taught the full range of duties.
