Dear Dr. Lull :

Please find enclosed a manuscript entitled "A Miocene Invertebrate Fauna from Burkeville, Newton County, Texas." This manuscript is for publication in the American Journal of Science. It contains one text figure and one plate. Presumably the article would go well with the previously offered paper on reptilian eggs and Mr. C.J. Hesse's paper on vertebrates from the same locality. Such a combination would give a well rounded description of the entire known fauna of the Burkeville locality.

In the present paper, plate , I have included illustrations of the supposed reptilian eggs. Therefore, it will not be necessary to print the zinc figure for the paper on reptilian eggs. However, I leave the elimination of the zinc figure up to you.
