Dear Renick:

This is to thank you for the collection from Smithville and for your information concerning the section at that place. I notice that you did not make mention of the fossiliferous sandstone at Gazley Creek. This sandstone adjoins the outcrops at Smithville and should be included in your section. Compare the publication of Armstrong Price and Katherine Van Winkle Palmer in the Journal of Paleontology concerning the maps of Leon County. I would like you to send me two complete white maps of the county for my use during the summer. The eastern half of the county map I would like to have with the geology as shown on the map I sent you. Is it possible to make a print (not a photostat) of the eastern half? So that the eastern half will appear as white ownership map with geologic boundaries. If this is not possible then I would like you to send me a trial photostat copy of it.

The fossils from Claiborne, Alabama, have been mostly washed, salted and identified. Anytime you come by College you can take them along with you or I can send them to you, if that is more convenient. Can you please send the Jackson fossils now?
