Thank you for sending me the separates of your recent publications. I am glad to keep up with crustacean literature in this fashion. I have not done much with crustaceans recently, except to collect material. Sooner or later I hope to return to them.

There are several younger men active occasionally in this field here. In general, I am not impressed with their work.

The locality at California Crossing of the Trinity River near Dallas was quite productive, when I described the crustaceans from that place. One could pick up about 30 of the Notopocorystes dicbrous in an afternoon. However, my publication served to pinpoint the locality for amateur collectors and to arouse their interest. On a recent visit to the same place, not even a single fragment could be found. One wonders whether I did really any good by publishing on them.
