Dear Doctor Stenzel:

In correcting the preliminary map of the State of Texas, the East Texas Geological Society drew the Cook Mountain-Yegua contact so that it crossed the Navasota River about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles above the Grimes-Madison County line and the H. & T.C. R.R. about 2 miles north of Bryan. That would throw the faunas near Edge which are certainly the same as those at Orell's Crossing an appreciable distance below the top of the Cook Mountain. Is this what you are teaching your students at Bryan?
