Dear Dr. Koler,

Enclosed is a letter from the Principal of St. Hugh's College offering terms on which you may reside at St. Hugh's during the Easter vacation, between the dates named. I hope this will meet your needs.

You will find St. Hugh's a very pleasant Society. It has a fairly good classical library, but little archaeology. For the latter you will of course use the Ashmolean library and the Bodleian. I will give you introductions for both when you arrive. St. Hugh's College is about a mile from the centre of Oxford, and my home is in the next road. This will be convenient, as I have all the script-material at home.

If I had not been laid up since Christmas with a bad cold, I should have handed over, by now, all the materials for the Script-books to the University Press; there is only about a week's work still to do on the manuscript.

If you arrive by Southampton or by Liverpool, there is no need to go through London unless you wish to do so: there are through-trains to Oxford, of which you will get details on the ship. On the other hand, Oxford is only about $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours from London, with a good train-service.
