Events on campus that 40 Acres Fest will be promoting: International Week, Blackfest, Texas Relays, Honors Day, Campus Race for The Cure, Ghana Cultural Exchange etc...

History: There was significant consideration given to the undergraduate experience at The University of Texas by a committee several years ago called the Bean committee. Their report as approved by the President, then Dr. William Cunningham, suggested that some unifying event be held on the campus to promote a sense of unity and pride. In the past, "Round-up" was for this purpose, but its effect has been negative in the past five or more years. Beginning in the spring of '92 a replacement came to be called "40 Acres Fest" and a committee to make it a reality was created.

Overview: This will be an event which celebrates the variety of campus activities at The University of Texas at Austin. The west mall will have booths and events put on by the registered organizations on campus. The community of Austin and the Texas EX-es will be invited to participate in any capacity they wish. The actual event will be centered around the booths, or presentations by the different organizations featuring several different displays, activities and/or items for sale. There will also be several local bands performing at various times on the main mall. University Area Partners will provide banners for Guadalupe and additional assistance in getting the community involved.
