Dear Henry:

Thank you so much for your letter of the 5th. I was pleased indeed to hear from you.

Not long ago I received from the USNM 5 specimens of Venericardia wenoensis from U. S. G. S. Locality 22355 (Renfro Loc. No. W 4), Cobb's Park, old brick strip pit $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles south of Maddox Ave., Fort Worth, Texas, Weno formation, Collectors Millicent and Ruby Renfro, 1949.

In view of the recent date of the collection, I should judge that this is not another case like your Hercoglossa one.

This paper I am working on is one I began in 1938, and that seems eons ago. It will be most helpful to have your paper, I am sure, so I do hope you will send me a copy when it appears. The difficulty I am having is getting good hinges; wenoensis is an example. I may have to slowly section one specimen to get at the hinge.

Are you using the family name Venericardidae or Carditidae? And what author are you using for the family name?

Let me know if there is any way we can be of help to you.
