As regards the first sign of the first word of the Ist line of the tablet No 2, which you suppose to be probably # , may I be allowed to that it is the same one which Hrozny quotes as ba way, in so far as he himself states that he quotes it from the Ill. London News .-

Regarding the difference between the sagns Y and Y Prof.Blegen, too, has told me that these two signs seem to be different; Evans, as you know, quotes them as forms of one and the same sign. The

publication of the tablets will clarify the question.
