Thank you very much for your letter of February 28.

We have a very accurate topographic map of the Bastrop-Lee Counties area, more precisely that area covered by longitude 97° to $97^{\circ} 30'$ and the latitude 30° to $30^{\circ} 30'$. This 30° quadrangle is delineated on the accompanying map. The individual sheets are made up in $7\frac{1}{2}'$ quadrangles.

I am not quite sure whether you want the entire $30'$ quadrangle or the $7\frac{1}{2}'$ quadrangle covering the Weches outcrop.

Thank you very much for the last paragraph of your letter. I appreciate this very much. Whatever we send you will have our name on the front side of the map.


